Habit Coat - and bone shoes perfect for the woman on the go!
(sew or attach "T's" and weeds on a coat - use real bones or cut some from paper for on the shoes.)

2. Something from yesteryear - a "hoop" skirt - and wearing "loafers" shoes.
(Attach embroidery hoops by yarn or ribbon onto a belt. Use bread sack over shoe)
3. A conventional costume - an "A" line skirt worn with a "scoop neck" blouse.
(Cut "A's" from construction paper and tie them with long cord or ribbon onto a belt - all around. With a low-necked blouse - wear an ice cream scoop - tied with ribbon or cord.)
4. This one really "picked" a winner - a cotton dress worn with a "picture" hat.
(fasten cotton balls all over a dress - and use a framed picture tied on with yarn or cord for the hat.)
5. a charming afternoon tea dress carrying a white handbag.
(fasten tea bags all over the dress - any other accessories you think might add to it. Cut a "hand" from white heavy paper - and put a handle on it for the "handbag")
6. For a man - a nautical theme. a "sailor" hat, P jacket and bell bottom trousers
(Put "for sale" signs on a man's hat - the letter P cut from construction paper or, depending on the season - use regular pea pods, fastened onto a jacket - and sew or pin bells on the bottom of the trousers)
7. Going back to the '50's era - a sack dress and wear a gold chain necklace.
(For the "sack" dress either wear a gunnysack or sew or pin paper sack on a dress. For the gold chain - use a gold colored paper chain or whatever)
8. A bright summer dress with cap sleeves - and to complete ensemble - "sling" pumps.
(use a sleeveless dress and pin baseball-type caps on the shoulders for cap sleeves. Attach slingshots to the shoes for the "sling" pumps).
9. A casual ensemble for leisure wear - a checked skirt worn with a T shirt.
(for this, attach old canceled checks to a skirt - and attach golf T's to a shirt. Could also attach doll faces (from the craft store) to shoes for "baby doll" shoes)
10. A person dressed for success - what every successful business woman should wear - a pin-striped suit - and wear a pill-box hat.
(For this, place rows of safety pins on the jacket and skirt. Use old pill containers in a box attached with ribbon or yarn for the hat.)
11. For a man - "sporting" garb for hunters - a "hunting hat" and a jacket with "games" - monopoly, sorry, etc. cut from magazines, etc. - sewn on jacket.
12. For that festive occasion - a satin ball gown - with a "plunging neckline" daring
(sew satin Christmas balls over a long dress - and for a necklace - use a plunger attached to yarn or ribbon).
13. A "cocktail" dress - should really strut around the room! and hat?
(Use cocktail feathers if you have them - or cut labels from fruit cocktail to sew or pin on a dress).
14. A seersucker dress: along
(Cut the name "Sears" from a catalog and attach to dress/with "suckers")
15. Narrator for show - could wear a large plastic bag with slits cut for head along
and arms - and labeled "potatoes" - as a "common-tater". Also wear a butter tub on head for a hat - + other accessories.
